

On June 26, 2010 the Town of Norwich Transfer Station/Recycling Center implemented the Zero-Sort Recycling System. This state-of-the-art system makes it much easier to recycle. There is no more sorting recyclables into multiple containers. Zero-Sort recycling is free to residents.

Zero-Sort will reduce our handling costs and promote a greater participation as it increases the types of materials that are eligible for recycling at our facility. For instance, with the old system only #1 and #2 plastics were accepted. We are now able to accept #1 through #7. This system will take 20% more trash out of the waste stream.

The Town of Norwich is one of the first towns in the State of Vermont to implement the Zero-Sort system. This system will make it possible for our community to achieve some of the highest trash diversion and recycling in the state.
