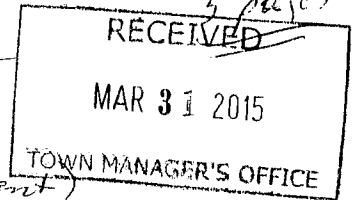

How should we do that? Police <sup>21x44</sup> <sub>maintain</sub>

- ① Downsize cut out interview rooms  
use Chief's office make secured  
evidence closet in chief's office

- (2) Have one open sg rm with 4 work stations  
place secure lockers in sg room
- (3) Have unisex handicap bathroom  
with shower and dressing area  
To be used by staff and visitors
- (4) make sm break room with counter,  
sink, coffee maker, microwave and  
refrig place shelving on counter for  
break supplies
- (5) mechanical/janitor room (enforce Janitor cleaning)
- (6) Clerk could also be in sg rm
- (7) meeting/training space  
Our town has wide open spaces  
in Tracy hall! The gym could  
be used for training — the  
selectboard room used for meetings  
Restrooms are there also!
- (8) Last but not least Forget Bread Loaf  
Find a local contractor to meet  
all codes ect ~~get~~ a concrete price  
allowing \$500 over concrete price

then decide how it will be financed

we may get volunteers to donate  
labor for plumbing, power and
