This is the Town Manager's Report for December 2015. Department specific monthly reports are attached.

General

• We have an executed grant agreement to install a 2 vehicle EV charging station at Dan & Whit's

Assessor

• The State has determined that Norwich's 2015 Equalized Education Property Value is \$732,739,000, the Coefficient of Dispersion (COD) is 7.75%, and the Common Level of Appraisal (CLA) is 95.35%. Because of the 2016 reappraisal, this CLA is not the figure that will be used in the final 2016 tax rate calculations.

Finance Department

• Delinquent taxes at the end of November were \$105,009. This compares to \$74,418 at the same time last year and \$166,711 in 2013.

Fire Department and Emergency Management

• The Fire Department responded to nine more calls in 2015 than in 2014. This is a four percent increase but there were many more significant incidents. The dry spring had area fire departments responding to multiple large brush fires. The largest was 135 acres in the Tigertown area of Norwich. The cold winter contributed to a large number of building fires where there was considerable damage.

Planning and Zoning

Fire and FAST Department

The Fire Department responded to nine more calls in 2015 than in 2014. While the numbers only show, a four percent increase there were many more significant incidents. The dry spring had area fire departments responding to multiple large brush fires. The largest was 135 acres in the Tigertown area of Norwich. The cold winter contributed to a large number of building fires where there was considerable damage.

Members participated in "winterizing" the apparatus and equipment. Pumps were drained and heat pans put on the trucks to reduce the chance of freeze-ups. We are updating our records management system by adding existing equipment and equipment maintenance records.

Training

FAST squad members attended training sessions on the new Vermont Protocols, CPR, AED and spinal immobilization. The new protocols permit EMTs to provide a higher level of advanced life support. This training was very "timely" as the FAST squad responded to two cardiac arrest calls. Fire training was "hands on"; members practice modern

As you requested, here are some of the monthly stats of the Police Department from the month of December 2015.

Norwich Officers responded to 102 incidents during the month of December, and of those calls two (2) were outside the officers work schedule meaning officers responded twice (2) to calls during off duty hours.

The Norwich Police participated in the Governors Highway Safety Program Click It Or Ticket **2015 Holiday Campaign**. The campaign was to focus on impaired driving as well as distracted driving. During the campaign officers initiated 32 motor vehicle stops and issued 8 tickets.

Norwich officers completed mandatory annual Firearms qualifications. The qualifications not only focus on shooting but also use of force, officer safety, public safety and "Shoot Don't Shoot" scenarios.

The Norwich Police Department would like to remind drivers to use extreme caution when driving in winter conditions. During the month of December officers investigated 12 motor vehicle crashes which is twice the monthly average of crashes investigated. Driving during severe winter storms is discouraged and motorists are advised to wait until conditions improve before venturing out.

From the daily log:

- Dec. 1-Tues: After lunch, because of freezing rain, we checked all of the gravel roads, sanding as necessary.
- Dec. 2-Wed: Because of freezing rain continuing, everyone rechecked their sand route, applying sand as necessary. Everyone checked them again after lunch because of early release from school.
- Dec. 29-Tues: Because of snow overnight, I called everyone in (except Craig Kinney) at 3:30 pm. Everyone plowed their designated routes 3 times. After that, everyone treated the paved roads. Mike T. did the sidewalks. Everyone finished at 8:00 pm.
- Dec. 30-Wed: Everyone was in at various times today for storm cleanup. Mike T. came in at 1:00 am. Sonny came in at 3:00 am. Everyone else came in at 4:00 am. 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Title 20: Internal Security And Public Safety

Chapter 171: Fire Districts

Subchapter 1: General Provisions

§ 2481. Establishment; change of limits

- (a) Upon application in writing of 20 or more freeholders or voters of a proposed fire district, the selectboard, after a duly warned public hearing, may establish such proposed fire district and define its limits. Such application shall contain a list of the powers mentioned in sections 2601 and 2603 of this title which the proposed district shall have and the district shall not have any of the other powers mentioned in these sections. Fire districts thus created shall be named by number in the order of their establishment. The selectboard shall file a certificate of its doings in the office of the town clerk for record. The selectboard may change the limits of a fire district upon a similar application and in like manner subject to the approval by the fire district at the annual or a special meeting of the fire district duly warned but any change in limits of a fire district may take place only with the consent of the majority of the landowners newly included within or excluded from those boundaries by that alteration. A record of any alteration of fire district boundaries shall be made by the town clerk. Only property contiguous to the fire district shall be the subject of an expansion of the boundaries of a fire district. For purposes of this subsection, a "public hearing" shall be a meeting of the legislative body of a town or of a fire district for the duly warned purpose of establishing or changing the limits of a fire district. Public notice for a public hearing required by this subsection shall be given not less than 15 days prior to the date of the public hearing by:
- (1) The publication of the date, place, and purpose of the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in the municipality affected; and
- (2) The posting of the same information in one or more public places within the municipality.
- (b) If a petition signed by five percent of the legal voters of the town objecting to the proposed establishment or change of limits of the fire district is presented to the town clerk within 30 days of the date of posting and publication of the notice required by subsection (a) of this section, the selectboard shall cause the question of whether the town shall establish or change the limits of the fire district to be considered at a special or annual meeting called for that purpose. After the meeting, the fire district shall be established or the limits changed unless a

majority of the voters of the town present and voting vote to disapprove of such establishment or change of limits. If a petition signed by five percent of the legal voters of a town objecting to a selectboard decision denying the establishment or the change of limits of a fire district is presented to the town clerk within 30 days of the selectboard decision, the selectboard shall cause the question of whether the town shall establish or change the limits of the fire district to be considered at a special or annual meeting called for that purpose. As many of you are already aware the Division of Property Valuation & Review has encountered significant processing issues this year which continue to impact the grand list. At this time there are still 85 applications awaiting approval along with approximately 100 easy out (special discontinuances) and discontinuances for the 2015 tax year. Consultation with PVR staff, VALA and the Tax Department legal and policy staff I has resulted in the following recommendations:

- Changes made to Current Use enrollments do not need to be subjected to the Errors & Omissions process as they are neither an error nor an omission made by the Lister or Assessor. Enrollment in the Current Use program often changes after the annual finalization of the Grand List due to appeals or discontinuances this year is only seeing a larger number of changes at this time of year due to processing constraints at the Department.
- Any requests for 30 day extensions (to Jan 31) to file the end of year 411 will be granted automatically due to special circumstances; requests can be submitted in writing (electronically or on paper) (§ 4342. Extensions by the Director). If a town does not choose to request an extension then the grand list can be finalized and any current use updates which come in after the fact should be filed with the grand list as an addendum.
- The final Education Fund "true-up" for 2015 takes place in March when Tax sends the finalized 2015 grand list to the Agency of Education. This will capture any activity which occurs after the January 15th "true-up" and prevent Vermont municipalities from incurring any unexpected liabilities from approved applications. The Current Use Section is taking every step possible at this time to make that final "true-up" as low impact as possible.
- If a town would like to print a final 411 but they are getting error messages due to current use parcels in progress it is possible to print and they can work with their DA or request an extension.

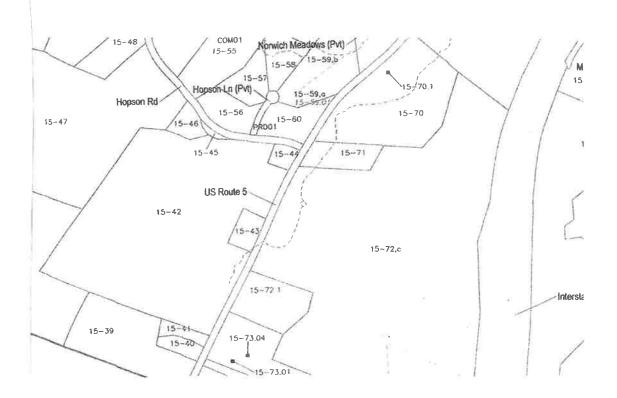

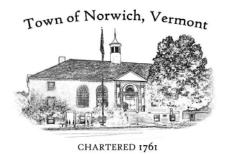

The Town of Norwich (Town) has determined that the public interest would not be best served by restoring this damaged facility because restoring the damaged facility would require a permit from the Agency of Natural Resources (ANR) and after long delays at their end the needed permit was denied on October 20, 2015.

This project is to meet the requirements in DAP9S2S.13 that ". . . the original damaged facility does not create an imminent and substantial endangerment to human health or the environment like causing the release of hazardous pollutants or becoming a hazard to human health, safety and welfare in a future flooding event."

A request for proposals is attached that details the scope of the proposed project. As recommended by the ANR River Management Engineer ". . . to remove an imminent public safety hazard and improve flood storage upstream of the village of Norwich." and the recommendations of the Senior Loss Control Consultant with the Vermont League of Cities and Towns to make the site safe and secure the following is proposed.

- Remove rubble (pieces of concrete) and debris that is in the brook.
- Demolish existing concrete pool dam.
- Remove hand-laid stone dam that is diverting the stream to the left side.
- Stabilize and armor the right bank, descending to a height of 4' with stone from the hand-laid stone dam.
- Finish stabilizing the bank with the material from the far side and slope the bank. This will utilize the old-growth maple and root system it provides for future bank stabilization, eliminating the disturbance of any archeological artifacts. Seed and mulch.
- Take remaining fill from the far side of the brook to create a level recreation area leading to the Ballard Trail.
- Place a few large rocks in various places within the stream to create natural swirl-pools for fish and other aquatic life.
- Seed and mulch all disturbed areas.
- Demolish the existing bath house and lifeguard building.
- Reestablish the gravel path from the parking lot to the woods.
- Remove non-compliant swing set and sand box play area.

 - h) In-stream working dates for all GP activities are from June 1st through October 1st; any in-stream work outside these dates will require an Individual Stream Alteration Permit authorization by the River Management Engineer.
 - i) This authorization has been posted for three days public comment. This authorization constitutes final approval.

If there are any changes in the project plan or deviation in construction from the plan, the Permittee must notify the River Management Engineer immediately.

Outline Specification for Public Works Building Addition Town of Norwich, Vermont

1. Addition to the Existing Building

- 1.1 Meet the applicable building and energy codes.
- 1.2 Include all permit fees.
- 1.3 Add a 40' x 100' addition to the back of the existing building. The new roof at the point it attaches to the existing building shall be located at least 2' below the existing roof.
- 1.4 Install a membrane roof with insulation over the roof of the existing building.
- 1.5 An engineering report and clarifications (copies attached) of the existing building stated that:

The lateral load resisting elements (braces, moment frames, etc) of the existing building were not visible in the sidewalls and the back wall during the site visit. The only wall where evidence of a lateral load resisting system was noted was the in the front wall, where a moment frame was located in one of the overhead door bays. Code requirements for existing buildings specify that if the loads to the lateral resisting systems of existing buildings increase by more than 10%, the entire lateral system must be ungraded to current code requirements. For this building, we have determined that a net dead load increase of 1.5 PSF is allowable without a full analysis/upgrade of the lateral load resisting systems.

- 1.5.1 At some time in the past an X brace(s) that was the lateral resisting system was removed from the rear wall of the existing building. Provide a lateral resisting system in the existing rear wall similar to the moment frame at the front of the building, or equivalent, to provide unobstructed access to the addition.
- 1.6 Add a new insulated overhead door that matches the existing doors in the right bay when facing the front of the building.
- 1.7 Interior Offices.
- 1.7.1 Construct interior office, break room and restroom at left rear corner of addition.
