Layne will investigate the topic further.

P. Silberfarb moved (M. Salmon 2nd) that the NCC research and implement the removal of invasive shrubs from the Norwich Senior Housing hedgerow and assist with their replacement with native shrubs, approved unanimously.

P. Silberfarb and C. Layne completed the goutweed fact sheet and distributed it for editorial comments. It will be posted in the Google docs after review.

M. Salmon reported that the cougar talk was filled to capacity and well received.

D. Hubbard reported on the effort to have a mountain bike trail run south of Beaver Meadow Road from the uphill end of the Ballard trail down to the powerline cut on the side of Charles Brown Brook opposite the Ballard trail.

The Hanover Biodiversity Committee will be running polinator gardening and management workshops in 2017 and there may be the opportunity for the NCC to be involved. The organizational meeting is Dec. 5, 8:30 am, in Hanover at the Black Community Center.
