# Methodology


• The following question was included as the first item on the Selectboard survey, which was fielded from mid-July thru Oct 2018.

"The Planning Commission of Norwich is embarking on a new planning cycle, and would like your feedback on priorities for our town. Please write your answers to the following question in the space provided: What do you think are the 3-5 most pressing issues facing the Town of Norwich?"

- There were 464 respondents to the question.
- A sub-committee of Planning Commission members worked with the Town Planner to complete an analysis. Most responses were coded by relevant chapter headings of the Town Plan. Additional categories were created, as needed. Word clouds were developed to provide additional detail and color on the top issues.
- The purpose of this exercise was to gather input on town priorities and help inform Planning Commission work on the Town Plan.


#### Tax Issues

Respondents emphasized the burden of high property taxes, concerns about increases, and diminishing affordability.


# Housing Issues

Respondents emphasized the need for more affordable housing to accommodate families, workforce, seniors, and lower income residents.

Respondents emphasized maintaining infrastructure, road conditions, and provisions for swimming and sewage treatment.

Respondents emphasized the importance of maintaining the rural character of the town.


# **Education Issues**
