**Clerk's Office Updates:**

In May Judy and I both attended the Vermont Municipal Clerks' and Treasurers' Association spring training. While this is geared toward new clerks, it provides an invaluable opportunity for networking among Vermont Clerks and Treasurers, and it also allow representatives from the state to update us on changes to statutes and election law.

The Clerk's office continued to remind delinquent dog owners of their licensing obligations, and by the time delinquent owners were reported to the Selectboard in June we were down to three outstanding owners. As of June 30<sup>th</sup>, we licensed 548 dogs (up 11 from last year's total count). I expect a few more new puppy licenses will trickle in over the next six months.

Election preparations began once again at the end of June. I heard from a Vermont clerk that we only have 18 weeks without election duties this year, and I believe most of those 18 weeks were in this past quarter.



Looking ahead, the State will be mailing General Election ballots to every registered voter by September 23<sup>rd</sup> – so whether or not you’ve requested an absentee ballot for the November election, you will receive one. PLEASE remember that if you choose to vote in person on November 5<sup>th</sup> you need to bring that ballot with you. (As usual, there’s a form you can fill out if you don’t remember to bring your ballot with you so that you can still vote in person.) Now is a great time to make sure that the Elections division has your correct address – you can check at [mvp.vermont.gov](http://mvp.vermont.gov).
